The new year can be a time of reflection as well as a time to look forward. If the first half of the school year did not go as well as planned there is plenty of time to make a positive change. Menomonie Middle School staff is here for all students. Our goal is to empower each student to reach their full potential. Sometimes students may need a little help this time of year. If this is true for you, please consider the following options:

- **Contact your CARES teacher** Our CARES program provides a teacher mentor for each student and parent/guardian. When tricky issues arise, communicating with your CARES teacher is usually the first step as we discover solutions.
- **Contact a teacher.** All teachers and staff members are ready, willing and able to help students and parents/guardians to explore ideas and solutions to support you. Many teachers offer academic support for students during lunch and/or after school.
- Contact your guidance counselor. Mrs. Horner or Mr. Mountin have potential solutions for every problem! Don't hesitate to consult with our counselors. Success with learning and achievement at school is an important part of our job here at MMS!
- Contact your principals. Meeting the needs of students and parents/guardians is extremely important to us. Students and parents/guardians are encouraged to visit with one or both of us. You may visit in person or communicate by telephone or email.
- **Explore our MMS website and MMS Team pages.** Many teachers use Chromebook technology to provide helpful blogs, spaces, and educational links to help students and parents/guardians understand learning standards and assignments.
- Review the weekly progress reports provided via email or have students show you on their chromebook. Students are able to complete missing assignments during WIN each Wednesday.

- Utilize Family Access. Skyward Family Access is an online grading tool that enables students and parents/guardians to view grading practices per course. Typically, grades are recorded on a weekly basis. Viewing Family Access regularly avoids a grading surprise at report card time. Parents/guardians must acquire a password code to access this tool. Password codes can be acquired by calling the Technology Department at our district Administrative Center 715-232–1642. If you do not have a computer, you may also use your smart phone or students Chromebook to access Family Access.
- **Get Involved** Students who participate in extra-curricular activities often find a natural support group of friends and adults to support academic and emotional needs throughout the school year.

chromebook Use and Care Tip

Students have done a great job using their Chromebooks. Many parents have reported that they put a time limit on use of the Chromebook at home. For example, at 9pm students must put their chromebook on the counter to charge for the night and leave it there until morning. This allows for a good night of sleep for the student and the Chromebook is fully charged and ready for school in the morning.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST

We are as committed as ever to the academic success of all of our students. The first and best tool that we can use to make sure all of our students are successful in school is to guarantee that each child begins the day with a healthy and nutritious breakfast – at home or at school.

We want to remind you that the School Breakfast Program is available **FREE** to all students in elementary and middle school. Breakfast is served starting at 7:15 am in the cafeteria each day. These supervised meals are nutritionally balanced, and vary daily.

School Breakfast is an ideal solution on busy mornings when kids are running late or parents have early work schedules. Oftentimes, kids are not hungry when they first wake up but are ready to eat when school begins. Whatever the reason, if breakfast at home is not convenient, please take advantage of breakfast here at school. Studies have shown that children who eat a nutritious breakfast have better behavior, better attendance, and improved test scores.



CONFERENCE PROCEDURE CHANGES

Conferences will be scheduled with your students CARES teacher. We will have scheduled conferences on the first ½ of every hour and then open times for all teachers the second ½ of every hour. Conferences are scheduled in 10 minute increments. Example: You are scheduled with your CARES teacher at 4:00pm. If you would like to visit with other teachers, you may stay and meet with any of those teachers between 4:30 and 5 pm. All of the open times are first come, first serve. If you are unable to meet with your CARES teacher during the assigned time, please let the teacher know so we can make adjustments as needed. We hope by adding the open conferencing times, parents will have an opportunity to meet with specific teachers of your choosing to discuss any issues.

LET THE TRANSITION TO HIGH SCHOOL BEGIN!



Believe it or not we are getting ready to start registering 8th grade students for high school! There will be many parts to the transition to Menomonie High School. Here is a brief synopsis of the dates and times to make note of. We strive to make this a fun and exciting time for you and your student.

Starting the week of **January 21st**, students will get general registration information from high school counseling staff in their 8th grade pods. Take some time to read through the materials, begin picking out classes you are interested in taking, and start to think about a four-year plan.

On **Monday, January 28th**, from **5:30 to 7 PM**, the high school staff will hold MHS Mustang Preview Night. At 5:30, parents and students will be welcomed by middle and high school principals in the auditorium. After a brief overview of scheduling at the high school, parents and students will be released to the commons where they are encouraged to meet with teachers from each department and learn about what courses Menomonie High School has to offer.

Following curriculum MHS Mustang Preview Night, students will be given assistance to register for their classes online. On **Friday, February 1st and Monday, February 4th**, students will register online during their CARES class for their high school course selections. High school counselors will be on hand to answer any questions students might have regarding scheduling, and make sure each student registers for the necessary number of classes for 9th grade.

Students will be given a copy of their schedule during freshman orientation at Menomonie High School, held on **August 13th through August 15th**. At this time, parents and students will receive valuable information about their high school experience, get their school pictures taken, and have the ability to meet with counselors regarding their schedule. More information will follow in May regarding this event.

Music Notes




Congratulations to all Band, Orchestra, and Choir students on wonderful December performances! These concerts are wonderful benchmarks to hear students' progress in their music classes.

Notes from the Health...



The Health Office is managed by Health Assistants and clerical staff. Our clerical staff is not medically trained beyond first aid. There is one school nurse for the entire school district. The Health Office is a space provided for sick or injured students. It is also where medications are safely stored and administered to Middle School students. The Health Office cannot accommodate several students who are ill or need to be picked up. Please provide the office with current work and cell phone numbers. Thank you for your assistance.

Seasonal illness is upon us. With cold weather everyone is staying inside, including the germs! Remember to:

- Wash your hands frequently
- Stay home if you have a fever or are vomiting/diarrhea until symptoms are resolved for 24 hours
- Eat nutrient dense foods and drink lots of water
- Continue to exercise! The CDC recommends 60 minutes or more of moderate to vigorous physical exercise daily for young adults.

We are also having an increasing number of students come to the health office for acetaminophen or ibuprofen. We do <u>not</u> have a stock medication of these, supply these from home. Students may keep these medications in our office as long as *a Non-prescription Medication Administration Form* is on file. These forms can be found in the health office. Please pick one up or we can send one home with your student.



Bridging Brighter Smiles: School-Based Dental Program

The dental clinic is offering a yearlong program with multiple visits to provide dental care for all children PK-8th grade. Dental professionals staff the clinic providing oral health education, supplies and preventive treatment. If you completed an enrollment form, your child should have received services. Clinic staff will be returning to the Middle School for follow-up visits for students who are already signed up. Not sure if your child is enrolled, or due for care? Online Family Access is available for all families in the district. To obtain a username and password, contact our district office at (715) 232-1642. Please, for security reasons, do NOT share your parent login with your child. Go to www.sdmaonline.com and click on the *Family Access Login* link on the left side. You can access your child's attendance, grades, fees and lunch balance.

Attendance Reminder

Good school attendance is one predicator of academic success. All Menomonie Middle School students are required to be in attendance from 7:43 am to 2:55 pm. Additionally, students are reminded that they have a maximum of 10 school days that can be missed during the school year for personal illness, religious services, and family activities. If a student needs to attend an appointment during school hours, a note from a parent/guardian or that business office needs to be turned into the Attendance Office the morning of your appointment so we can get your student a pass and that it does not count against those 10 days. If your child is absent, please call the Attendance Office.

Sign up to receive daily announcements, newsletters, and other important updates. The link is available on the middle school website.

Go to Parents & Community, then to Parent Tools. You will see a drop down menu listing Daily Announcements. Click on that link. This will take you to the Middle School Announcements page. On the right side is a Subscribe button. Click on that and follow the prompts.

Please remember to update your information, emergency contacts, and fill out permission forms on Skyward Family Access for your student(s). This is important for field trip permission, student and bus code of conduct, video/photographing permission, computer network agreement, health services standing orders, and more. You can also pay online fees for the middle school and sports fees.

Free and Reduced Lunch

Families who may be experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to apply for the free and reduced lunch program. Guidelines change and family circumstances change as well. Applications are available in the middle school office, as well as the district office. Many times, our families are struggling to make "ends meet" and if they are eligible for assistance, it could really help their family. In addition, students who meet free and reduced eligibility are often eligible for other programs. However, if an application is not submitted, they cannot receive that service.
