LEARNING IS NOT A RACE! The Benefits of Summer School Math & Literacy

It is very normal for each student to learn at a different pace. Some students need more than one academic school year (September to June) to achieve all grade level learning standards as outlined by our standards based report card. Grade level achievement is an important part of being prepared for the next grade level of learning.

MMS teachers make summer school math and/or literacy course recommendation for students in 6th, 7th and 8th grade who are identified with a need for additional time and support to adequately achieve grade level learning targets in the area of math and/or literacy. This instructional extension of the school year is beneficial to students in many ways. It empowers continuous learning in the areas of math and literacy. Typically, teachers are working with students in small groups in summer school courses. This is unlike the large class size learning environment students participate in during the school year. *Small* class sizes often make a *big* difference for students.

Students recommended for summer school math and/or literacy courses will be registered automatically by teachers and administration. Students will receive a summer school schedule in the mail from our SDMA Administrative Service Center. In most situations, students may select additional courses of choice to complete a full summer school schedule in addition to the math and/or literacy course recommended.

If you are not recommended for a summer math and/or literacy course by one of our teachers, but would like to attend – please call me – Principal Everson to register.

Attendance Reminder



Good school attendance is one predicator academic success. All Menomonie Middle School students are required to be in attendance from 7:43 am to 2:54 pm. Additionally, students are reminded that they have a maximum of 10 school days that can be missed during the school year for personal illness, religious services, and family activities. If a student needs to attend an appointment during school hours, a note from a parent/guardian or that business office needs to be turned into the Attendance Office the morning of your appointment so we can get your student a pass and that it does not count against those 10 days. If your child is absent, please call the Attendance Office.

Sign up to receive daily announcements, newsletters, and other important updates. The link is available on the middle school website.

Go to Parents & Community, then to Parent Tools. You will see a drop down menu listing Daily Announcements. Click on that link. This will take you to the Middle School Announcements page. On the right side is a Subscribe button. Click on that and follow the prompts.

Please remember to update your information, emergency contacts, and fill out permission forms on Skyward Family Access for your student(s). This is important for field trip permission, student and bus code of conduct, video/photographing permission, computer network agreement, health services standing orders, and more. You can also pay online fees for the middle school and sports fees.

Free and Reduced Lunch

Families who may be experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to apply for the free and reduced lunch program. Guidelines change and family circumstances change as well. Applications are available in the middle school office, as well as the district office. Many times our families are struggling to make "ends meet" and if they are eligible for assistance, it could really help their family. In addition, students who meet free and reduced eligibility are often times eligible for other programs. However, if an application is not submitted, they cannot receive that service. Written messages can be dropped off in our Idea Boxes located in the middle school hallways. Paper forms are available next to each box.


• Send an Email to an Adult You Trust Sending an email to an adult you trust is a safe and easy way to share. We will respond in a timely manner.


Yearbook Delivery

Middle School Garden



Students will be eating the food they grow. Thanks to a grant from the **Community Foundation of Dunn County** the middle school was able to erect and sustain a school garden last spring and we will plant, take care of and harvest our garden again this year.

The garden has 12 raised beds. Each pod will be in charge of two 12 X 3 raised beds. The garden is fenced for rabbits and deer.

Students are starting tomatoes and tomatillos seeds in their classrooms, and they will plant onions,

potatoes, basil, pumpkins and squash seeds in early May. When school starts in the fall, students will plant lettuce, spinach, and cilantro. Garlic can be planted in the middle of October.



Food Service Director Michelle Kloser wants to use the food students grow in the lunches made and served this fall.

Because school is out for the summer, the garden will need some volunteers to help with watering and weeding. Seed and plant donations are also appreciated; ideas for beautification of the fence and garden are encouraged as well. Planning Summer Appointments...

If your child is due for a comprehensive medical exam, summer is a great time to schedule that appointment. If your child is 11 years of age or older and needs a sports physical, that exam and paperwork can be covered during a comprehensive exam as well. You may schedule a sports physical only, if all other immunizations are current. A sports physical is required for all students participating in middle school sports. A sports physical is good for two years. You may call the middle school office to confirm if your child needs a sports physical.

If you have questions about immunization requirements, please contact the health office at (715) 232-1673 ext. 30103. Call your primary care provider to be sure your child's shot records are up-to-date before summer ends. Wisconsin immunization requirements affect ALL incoming 6th graders for the 2016-2017 school year. **Now is a great time to schedule an appointment to meet all physical and immunization requirements.**

Students with health plans/medication will receive a mailing during the summer to update their health concerns. Please help our health services coordinator by updating and completing this information **before** the start of the 2016-2017 school year.

Wisconsin Immunization Law

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Wisconsin School Immunization requirements affect all incoming 6th grade students. **We** recommend checking your child's shot record and scheduling the appropriate vaccines before the start of the 2016-17 school year.

<u>Tdap vaccine</u>: Please note that one dose of Tdap vaccine is currently recommended for adolescents and adults. The Tdap school requirement among students in grades 6 through 12 is only one dose. If a student received a tetanus-containing vaccine (such as Td vaccine) within the last 5 years of entering the grade it is required, the student is considered compliant and a Tdap vaccine is not required. The date of the Td vaccine should be provided to your child's school.

Recommendations for vaccines are made by the Advisory Committee on Immunizations Practices to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). These vaccines are available from your child's health care provider or Dunn County Public Health (DCPH). DCPH offers immunizations throughout the year. You may set up an appointment by calling (715) 232-2388. **Parents are required to have their children vaccinated, provide proof or claim a waiver with the child's school**.







Please pick up any medication in the health office on or before the last day of school. Any medication that is not picked up will be discarded. For safety reasons, we do not keep medication

stored in the health office during the summer. Students may pick up their medication at the end of the school day. Thank you for your assistance!

Students with health plans will receive a mailing during the summer to update their health concerns. Please help our health services coordinator by updating and completing this information **<u>before</u>** the start of the 2016-2017 school year. If your child has a new or reoccurring health concern, please notify the office at (715) 232-1673 with any updates or current emergency contact numbers.

If you have questions about immunization requirements, please contact the office at (715) 232-1673 ext. 30103. The new requirements affect incoming 6th graders for the 2016-2017 school year. Summer is a great time to schedule an appointment to meet immunization requirements or if your child needs a sports physical. Please contact Dunn County Public Health at 715-232-2388 or your personal care provider.

If you have a 5th grader who will be coming to the Middle School next year, please check your child's shot record and schedule an appointment for immunizations if they are not up-to-date.

Does your child need the chickenpox vaccine? Or the Tdap booster?

All students grades K-12 will need either proof of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or proof of immunity for the 2016-2017 school year. Students in grades 6-8 are required to have two (2) doses of varicella. A child is considered compliant with the law if either a vaccination date is provided, or date the child had the chickenpox disease. The vaccine is available at the Dunn County Health Department or you can consult with your primary health care provider. Chickenpox is highly contagious. The vaccine is recommended for young children and older children who have <u>not</u> had the chickenpox.

Tdap means adolescent tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis vaccine. If your child received a dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine, such as Td, within 5 years of entering the grade in which Tdap is required, your child is compliant and a dose of Tdap vaccine is not required. Students in grades 6-8 are required to have a Tdap booster.

When Hard Times Happen

Sometimes things happen that are out of our control; being laid off from our job, car trouble, our refrigerator dying, or receiving a huge medical bill in the mail. Other times we may find ourselves in a situation where our family has no place to go.

When a family is facing homelessness, it can be an extremely scary and overwhelming experience. We may feel powerless over the situation when our family finds themselves living in a shelter (such as the Bridge to Hope or Stepping Stones), having to move into another family's home (double-up), living in a hotel, camper/campground, or in a car. Please know that you are not alone and there are resources available to help.

Upon notification to the school, your child will be provided free lunch until your family has secured housing. Your child also has the right to continue attending the same school, regardless of if your family is currently sheltered in a different part of town. The school district will work with you to ensure your child has a way to get to and from school.

The school district also employs a full-time school social worker, whose job is to partner with your family and help you navigate through this difficult time. The school social worker, Meghan Eisenbraun, may be reached by calling 715-232-1642 x 30110 or by emailing <u>meghan eisenbraun@msd.k12.wi.us</u>.

In addition to school, there are many other community supports available. Agencies such as Stepping Stones and WestCAP work to help families find housing. Making the Right Connections

Did you know there are agencies in our community whose main purpose is to help individuals and families through hard times?
