#### Dear MMS Families,

Are you planning a family trip for the holidays? As you think about your arrangements, we want to stress the importance of sending your child to school every day possible. Every year, absences spike in the weeks before and after the winter holiday as families squeeze in a few more vacation days. It's time to break that cycle. We know that just a few missed days here and there, even if they're excused absences, can add up to too much lost learning



time and put your child behind in school. Put simply, too many absences at any age can affect a student's chances for academic success and eventually for graduation.

## Student Drop Off

We appreciate your assistance in keeping the traffic flowing during morning drop off. By driving as far forward in the drop off lane as possible and exiting the vehicle along the entire drop off zone, we are able to keep a better flow to the traffic. Recently, we were able to have "drop off" zones painted along with right/left turn lanes as you exit the middle school to turn on 21st Street. We hope this helps to limit the backlog of vehicles leaving the middle school.

Most importantly, please use caution when dropping off your children. Unfortunately, we have had a couple of close calls recently as people accelerate through the open lane. People are using the open lane as they have either already dropped the students off or they are attempting to get to the front of the drop off line. For the safety of our students and staff, we ask that students are dropped off in the right lane next to the sidewalk.

Recently, we have had an increased number of people choosing to drop off students in the staff parking lot. We do not encourage this practice as it results in students crossing through the traffic lanes. This has become even more dangerous as the people in the right lane have to look over their left shoulder anticipating traffic accelerating from behind. Their eyes should be focused ahead on the pedestrians crossing from the staff parking lot. This becomes even more dangerous as the mornings grow darker and roads turn snow covered and slippery. We also have more students being dropped off in the winter versus walking and riding bikes. Thankfully, the large majority of you exercise caution, patience, and proper protocol each day during drop off. We appreciate your cooperation.

#### **Notes from the Front Office:**

#### **RE: Student Bus Passes, Student Appointments, Student Messages**

Middle school students are busy young people!

The MMS front office assistants are available to support families and students when the need for a bus pass, pass from class, or student message occurs. To better serve you and to minimize classroom interruptions, keep the following guidelines in mind:

- ✓ Students can be notified at lunch about messages or deliveries.
- ✓ Students cannot be paged during the school day: 7:43 am through 3:05 pm.
- ✓ Bus passes must be requested by students/families in writing. Text messages are not accepted.
- ✓ Students can be released from class to attend appointments by securing a Classroom Pass Release from the front office. A Classroom Pass Release requires a written excuse from a parent/guardian. This excuse must include the following information: date, time of pick up, and general reason. The time listed on the excuse will be minutes prior to the anticipated parent arrival time.
- ✓ Written excuses are preferred rather than parent/guardian phone calls to avoid unnecessary interruptions to the classroom. Please try to avoid showing up to pick up students at the last minute.
- ✓ Students released from class during the school day must wait in the front office reception area for a parent/guardian to arrive. Parents are not required to come to the office prior to leaving the school building.
- ✓ Students returning to school after appointments must check in the front office before returning to class. Students will get a pass back to class upon their return. Parent/Guardians are not required to come into the building. If you get a note from the doctor, your student can turn that in upon arrival.
- ✓ Please do not text students during class as students are not allowed to use their cell phones during the school day. Try to make arrangements prior to the beginning of the school day.

#### Parent/Family Online Access

Online Family Access is available for all families in the district. To obtain a username and password, contact our district office at (715) 232-1642. Please, for security reasons, do NOT share your parent login with your child. Go to <a href="https://www.sdmaonline.com">www.sdmaonline.com</a> and click on the *Family Access Login* link on the left side. You can access your child's attendance, grades, fees and lunch balance.

#### Attendance Reminder

Good school attendance is one predicator of academic success. All Menomonie Middle School students are required to be in attendance from 7:43 am to 3:05 pm. Additionally, students are reminded that they have a maximum of 10 school days that can be missed during the school year for personal illness, religious services, and family activities. If a student needs to attend an appointment during school hours, a note from a parent/guardian or that business office needs to be turned into the Attendance Office the morning of your appointment so we can get your student a pass and that it does not count against those 10 days. If your child is absent, please call the Attendance Office.

#### **Parents**

Sign up to receive daily announcements, newsletters, and other important updates. The link is available on the middle school website.

Go to Parents & Community, then to Parent Tools. You will see a drop down menu listing Daily Announcements. Click on that link. This will take you to the Middle School Announcements page. On the right side is a Subscribe button. Click on that and follow the prompts.

Please remember to update your information, emergency contacts, and fill out permission forms on Skyward Family Access for your student(s). This is important for field trip permission, student and bus code of conduct, video/photographing permission, computer network agreement, health services standing orders, and more. You can also pay online fees for the middle school and sports fees.

#### Free and Reduced Lunch

Families who may be experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to apply for the free and reduced lunch program. Guidelines change and family circumstances change as well. Applications are available in the middle school office, as well as the district office. Many times, our families are struggling to make "ends meet" and if they are eligible for assistance, it could really help their family. In addition, students who meet free and reduced eligibility are often times eligible for other programs. However, if an application is not submitted, they cannot receive that service. Sending an email to an adult you trust is a safe and easy way to share. We will respond in a timely manner.

# Smart Girls Rock!



The event Smart Girls Rock! took place at Menomonie Middle School on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, in its first year back since 2019. Smart Girls Rock! is a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) event meant to encourage interest in STEAM careers among middle school girls. Women continue to be underrepresented in the sciences, making up only 27% of the science and engineering workforce (US Census Bureau, 2019). In its sixth year, 209 sixth through eighth-grade girls explored 20 different STEAM careers and met 35 women from those careers in Dunn County. They were able to ask questions about what high school or college classes to take, what got them interested in that career, and what is their favorite and least favorite part. Girls were also involved in hands-on activities such as taking lab samples, practicing CPR, or using a blacklight to find glue in windows. Women professionals from the Menomonie Police Department, 3M, Phillips Medisize, AgSource, Red Cedar Dentistry, Anderson Windows, Mayo Clinic Pediatrics and Physical Therapy, Nursing, Big Dot of Happiness, EMS and First Response, Menomonie School District Technology Services, and departments from UW-Stout Entrepreneurship, Anthropology, Art Education, Mathematics, Interior Architecture and Game Design, Wildlife Biology, Learning Information Technology, and Digital Marketing Technology.


## Cardinal Glass/Phillips Medisize

# Title I is a Partnership

The Partnership Agreement, usually discussed and signed at fall conferences, is an agreement (compact) outlining the role of the family, the school, and the student in a learning partnership. This shared responsibility greatly increases the chance of student success.

# Students are Involved

Students create academic and social goals with their teacher and parents/guardians. Other areas students commit to in their school year success include: participating in class learning, asking for help when needed, and following school



# Parents Are Involved

Parents are their child's first and most important teachers. Children learn language by interacting with their parents. Parents influence their child's educational attitudes, work habits and interests.

In Title I, parents and teachers build a cooperative partnership with students. Parents help to plan and review their school and district Title I program.



# Teachers are Involved

Teachers design programs that involve children in a rich variety of learning experiences. This flexible programming takes place within the regular classroom and/or in a Title I classroom, as a targeted supplemental pullout program. Title I funded Intervention Specialists provide instruction to reinforce and enhance core classroom learning.

Title I programs stress positive attitudes toward learning and achievement of high academic standards. Intervention Specialists also work with families to share strategies and techniques to help their children become more successful learners.



Title I Services

The school-wide Title I Project Schools - Downsville, River Heights, Wakanda, and Menomonie Middle School - provide supplemental support on behalf of all students in their buildings. A variety of flexible and timely support systems are implemented as needs are identified.

The Targeted Assistance Schools - St. Joseph's and St. Paul's- provide targeted, very small group services to children identified as most in need of academic support in reading and/or math, within the grade levels identified as having the most needs during the Title I Targeted Needs Assessment process each spring.
